## Message from Town Administrator

- Be sure to call the Town Administrator if your trash, yard waste, and or bulk waste is not picked up. **Recycling waste is a county service; call 311 (Prince George's County call center) and ask for recycling service.**
- Please remember you can set out **3 bulk items** every week. **Bulk trash is old furniture**, no metal items (stoves, small TV's, water heater, tires etc is not bulk material and will not be picked up). **If you have old appliances such as stoves, refrigerators, washing machines or dryers call the Town office to make arrangements for the Town to pick it up. There is a fee for the Town to pick up.** The same is true for car tires. Bulk material is picked up on **every Thursday**.
- Trash pickup is **every Monday unless** it is a national holiday. Trash will be picked up on Tuesday following a National Holiday.
- **Please note:** several residents have purchased a second trash bin for those days when they have more trash. The extra bin sells for \$60 plus a \$15 delivery charge. Only Town approved bins will be acceptable for the automated truck.
- Please remember to remove **anything that collects water** as it becomes a place for mosquitoes to put their larva and produce more mosquitoes. The tiger mosquitoes are vicious and heavy populated in Forest Heights. They will attack during the day or night. Be aware and check for ticks as they may attach themselves to the body, pay special attention to hair, between toes and underarms. Everyone, including your pets is susceptible. Check with your doctor on the proper removal.
- **several residents** have asked about the different colors marked on our streets: blue is for water (WSSC), green is for sewer (WSSC), yellow is for gas (WG), red is for electric (PEPCO) and orange is for (fiber optic & phone)
- The residents will soon receive letters regarding warranty service for your sewer line from the house to the sewer main line. The program is sponsored by the National League of Cities and administered by Utility Service Partners, Inc. and approved by the Forest Heights mayor and council. The service costs \$7.95 per month or \$90.40 per year. The water line warranty service will begin in October with a letter to the residents and covers the cost to replace the water line from the house to the meter. The cost for this service is \$5.95 per month or \$66.40 per year. Most of us have older homes built in the early forty's and our lines are getting old. As noted letters will be coming out in mid May.
- We have a New Code Enforcement Officer Ricardo Smith. Town codes will be strictly enforced. The Town code and ordinances are available on our website at [www.forestheightsmd.gov](http://www.forestheightsmd.gov) or printed copy is available at the Town Hall.
- South Huron has had major repair of the WSSC main water line and will soon be milled and Overlaid by WSSC. The Town will soon begin work on Rolph Drive now that we have confirmed the contractor. Plans for installation of sidewalks along north Huron are being completed as well as street repair, including the area around the circle.
- My apologies to the residents as we once again had issues with the shredding service; we now have an agreement with a company in Alexandria for 2015 and 2016. We modified the program to offer this service to the residents twice a year at a substantial savings over what we would have paid for the service scheduled on the 25<sup>th</sup> of April. **The Towns shredding program is scheduled for June 13<sup>th</sup> 2015 and November 14<sup>th</sup> 2015. Then in 2016 the program is scheduled for April 23<sup>rd</sup> and October 22<sup>nd</sup>. All the dates are Saturdays from 9 am – 12 noon. Please call me if you have any questions.**



## FREE "CARING FOR SENIORS WITH LUPUS" SEMINAR MAY 28, 2015 FORUM FROM 1:00-2:00 P.M.

### What is Lupus?

Lupus is a chronic, autoimmune disease that can damage any part of the body (skin, joints, and/or organs inside the body). Chronic means that the signs and symptoms tend to last longer than six weeks **and** often for many years.

In lupus, something goes wrong with your immune system, which is the part of the body that fights off viruses, bacteria, and germs. Normally our immune system produces proteins called antibodies that protect the body from these invaders. Autoimmune means your immune system cannot tell the difference between these foreign invaders and your body's healthy tissues ("auto" means "self") and creates autoantibodies that attack and destroy healthy tissue. These autoantibodies cause inflammation, pain, and damage in various parts of the body.

Lupus is not contagious, not even through sexual contact. Lupus is not like or related to cancer. People of all races and ethnic groups can develop lupus (though women of color are two to three times more likely to develop lupus than Caucasians).

## Health Seminar on Mental Health and Aging

Annette Sarcinelli, LCSW-C, Director of Outpatient Services at QCI Behavioral Health, spoke at our April 23 Health Seminar on Aging and Mental Health.

Ms. Sarcinelli went over the 10 Symptoms of Mental Illness\* that caregivers should keep an eye out for:

- Sad or depressed mood lasting longer than two weeks
- Social withdrawal; loss of interest in things that used to be enjoyable
- Unexplained fatigue, energy loss, or sleep changes
- Confusion, disorientation, problems with concentration or decision-making
- Increase or decrease in appetite; changes in weight
- Memory loss, especially recent or short-term memory problems
- Feelings of worthlessness, inappropriate guilt, helplessness; thoughts of suicide
- Physical problems that can't otherwise be explained: aches, constipation, etc.
- Changes in appearance or dress, or problems maintaining the home or yard
- Trouble handling finances or working with numbers

On March 13, County Executive Baker announced his 2016 Budget Proposal, which included a dramatic increase in funding for PGCPS (~ over \$130 million). PGCPS is currently ranked 23<sup>rd</sup> out of 24 public school systems in Maryland. The infusion of the funds will be used by PGCPS to implement their SY2016-2020 Strategic Plan, with the ultimate goal to move PGCPS into the top 10 school systems by 2020.

To fund the Strategic Plan, Baker has proposed raising property taxes by 15 percent, and raising the telecommunications tax from 8 to 12 percent, according to the Prince George's County Gazette.

The final decision will rest with the County Council, which must approve the county budget by June 1.

## MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

Town of Forest Heights will participate in the Mosquito Control Program sponsored by the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA). Adult mosquito surveillance and possible spraying will commence on June 1, 2015 and run through September 17, 2015.

You can reduce the emergence of mosquitoes in your area by preventing water from accumulating, standing and stagnating in artificial containers such as toys, pails, barrels, tires, boats, swimming pools, swimming pool covers, plant containers, etc.

You have the right to be excluded from ULV spraying in your neighborhood. If you object, your request should be in writing and should be directed to: Maryland Department of Agriculture, Mosquito Control Section, 8071 Greenmead Drive, College Park, MD 20740.

You should keep in mind, however, that if mosquito-borne diseases or other relative conditions threaten the public health and safety of this community, the MDA will act in the best interest of the citizens of this Town and reinforce the spraying in your area.

A copy of the Maryland Department of Agriculture Mosquito Control Policy Statement along with a Request for Exemption From Adult Mosquito Control Services is on the Town website. Should you agree to the truck-mounted fogging units which apply ultra-low-volume spray, you don't have to do anything, but if you object, you must use the enclosed form to express your withdrawal from participation.

This application must be completed by the individual residing within a community participating in the Mosquito Control Program who wishes to have his/her property excluded from adult mosquito control pesticide applications by truck-mounted ultra low volume (ULV) sprayers. The attached statement entitled "Objection to Adult Mosquito Control" explains the Maryland Department of Agriculture's policy on individual objectors. Please retain it for your files.
