**Community Spotlight:** Jocelyn B.D. Moore was born in Washington, DC and is a lifetime resident of Prince George's County, Maryland. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Theatre Arts from Morgan State University in Baltimore, Md. She manages her own theatre production company JM Entertainment and is the author of four books: **Men of the Bible**, **Women of the Bible**, and her latest releases--**Conversations In Faith** (which chronicles the lives of Biblical women and men of the bible) and **Rainbows and Valleys** (a collection of short skits and monologues for teens and young adults). **Women of the Bible** has been performed at several churches as a stageplay. In April 2012, she and her company were

recognized by her college alma mater in the spring edition of the Morgan State University Alumni Newsletter for her achievements in literature. In October 2013, she was interviewed in the Southern Maryland Independent Newspaper where she expressed her desire to inspire, and enlighten people through her writing. Jocelyn is a member of "CAAPA"-- Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts.

Jocelyn currently serves as a Board Member for the new Southern Maryland Youth Theatre Group founded in Forest Heights, Md. The theatre group will promote youth interest in radio, television and the performing arts. In her spare time, she enjoys reading, spending time with her family, and watching old movies. Her favorite saying "God put us here for a purpose. Without Him we are nothing."

**Q: How/why did you get involved with the Southern Maryland Youth Theatre Group?**

**A:** A member of the Board of Directors liked my work and said they were planning to start a "Southern Maryland Youth Theatre Group" and thought my experience as an author and director would be a great asset to the group. I have years of experience as a church youth leader and mentor to teens and young adults. Today's youth need all the love and guidance we can give them. There is so much talent out there that needs to be discovered and cultivated. The Southern Maryland Youth Theatre Group wants to help the youth to achieve their full potential in the performing arts. We want them to grow as well as set and execute goals for themselves. I believe children's dreams should be encouraged and fostered.

**Q: You have a show opening in the DC area. Could you tell us about that?**

**A:** My new release, "Conversations In Faith" consists of in-depth versions of two of my earlier works, "Women of the Bible" and "Men of the Bible." "Women of the Bible" will be performed at the Oxon Hill Library, in Oxon Hill, Maryland on Saturday, November 1, 2014. The play is a fictional work based on historical facts. The setting creatively introduces audiences to the lives of women of the Bible with a modern day twist of their stories being told as they guest star and are interviewed on a popular talk show.

**Q: Where does your inspiration come from? Who are your biggest influencers/role models?**

**A:** My inspiration comes from my mother and high school drama teacher. My mother wrote and directed plays at our church and my teacher selected me as the lead role in my high school play because she saw something special in me. It was hard work but I loved it. I loved the applause and the thrill of people liking what I did. It made me feel good and gave me confidence. My parents and teacher were the biggest influences and role models in my life.

### BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

#### FOREST HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT

As part of our commitment to overall safety the Town Forest Heights Police Department would like to help you with your preparations by offering these simple safety tips.

#### School Zone Driving Safety Tips

- Be on the lookout for school zone signals and ALWAYS obey the speed limits.
- When entering a school zone, be sure to slow down and obey all traffic laws.
- Always stop for school busses that are loading or unloading children
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of and watch out for children near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, in school parking lots, etc.
- Never pass other vehicles while driving in a school zone.
- Never change lanes while driving in a school zone.
- Never make U-Turns while driving in a school zone.
- Never text while driving in a school zone
- Avoid using a cell phone, unless it is completely hands-free, while driving in a school zone.

Unless licensed to do so, never use handicap or emergency vehicle lanes or spaces to drop off or pick up children at school.

#### WALKING TO SCHOOL

- Leave early enough to arrive at school at least 10 minutes prior to the start of school.
- Use the same route every day and never use shortcuts. Go straight home after school. Do not go anywhere else without permission.
- Always use public sidewalks and streets when walking to school.
- Demonstrate traffic safety awareness and pick the safest route between your home and the school and practice walking it with your children.
- Try and walk to school with other students. There is strength in numbers.
- Teach your children to recognize and obey traffic signals and signs.
- Only cross streets at designated crosswalks, street corners and traffic controlled intersections.
- Always look both ways before crossing the street and never enter streets from between obstacles like parked cars, shrubbery, signs, etc.
- Avoid talking to strangers. Teach your children to get distance between themselves and anyone who tries to approach or make contact with them.
- If a stranger does approach your child, make sure they know to immediately report the in the incident to you or a teacher.
- Teach your children to never get into a vehicle with anyone, even if they know them, without your permission.

### ARTICLE 5 - CANVASSING AND SOLICITING

Section 5.1: It shall be unlawful for any peddler, canvasser, solicitor, hawker, itinerant merchant or transient merchant, or transient vendor of merchandise, to go in or upon private or public property in the Town for the purpose of selling or soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise, or services, without having been requested or invited to do so by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said property.

Section 5.2: The prohibitions of Section 5.1 shall not apply to sales by local civic, charitable or religious organizations, or to the sale or soliciting of orders for the sale of food and other farm and garden products, laundry and dry cleaning services and newspapers.

## Community Members Complete Construction on New Playground in Forest Heights

Forest Heights, MD. – In less than a day, approximately 50 community members finished installation on a new playground at Fox Way and Mohican Drive in the Town of Forest Heights at the Aug. 30 Community Build Day.

The theme for the Build Day was “Forest Heights Community at Play.” Community volunteers worked in teams to assemble each element of the play structure. Other tasks included the construction of arbors, benches and picnic tables, as well as the mixing of cement. Metro Recreation/Burke provided the playground equipment.

“The FoxMo [Fox Way/Mohican Drive] Playground brought the community together to work on a project benefiting our youngest residents and created a ‘place’ that we could all take ownership in,” said Forest Heights Mayor Jacqueline Goodall. “The project stands as a visible reminder of what we can accomplish with each of us working together — residents, business partners and community stakeholders — in making a difference in the areas that we call home.”

The Build Day also featured games, food and live entertainment, which included a performance by Ronald McDonald. Volunteers distributed a total of 84 T-shirts to attendees at the event. Children also took part in a mural project, where they created paintings that represented visions of their new playspace, which will be displayed on site.

“The Forest Heights Community Build Day was a challenging, yet ecstatic day for all of us,” said Charmaine Turner, Tot Lot Development Coordinator. “Just seeing our kids and volunteers devote all of their time and effort into a community landmark that will benefit future generations of Town residents was a rewarding experience in of itself.”

The playspace will officially open to the public once the fence and ground cover has been installed. A ribbon cutting ceremony on the new playground site will be scheduled later in the fall.

Community members are also encouraged to come out on Oct. 18 from 9 a.m. to noon – which is the day when Prince George’s County will host its “Clean Up, Green Up” initiative – to work on landscaping the area outside the playground.

In 2013, the Town of Forest Heights was awarded a \$20,000 Let’s Play Construction Grant from Dr Pepper Snapple Group and KaBOOM! to fund construction for the new playground. The grant was part of Let’s Play, a community partnership led by Dr Pepper Snapple Group to get kids and families active nationwide. Additional funding for the project will come from an Open Space Grant from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources and the Town of Forest Heights.

Since 2012, Forest Heights has earned two gold medals and one bronze medal as part of *Let’s Move! Cities, Towns and Counties* (LMCTC).

Forest Heights was also among 217 communities nationwide that had earned Playful City USA status in 2013. Playful City USA is a national program advocating for local policies that increase play opportunities for children. KaBOOM!, the national non-profit organization dedicated to giving kids the childhood they deserve by bringing play to those who need it most, created Playful City USA in 2007 to help local governments address the lack of play. The program also complements First Lady Michelle Obama’s *Let’s Move!* initiative, which aims to combat the childhood obesity epidemic within a generation. ### Message from Town Administrator

**County recycling program questions:** call 311 and raise the questions that you have about recycling and the operator will direct your call to the appropriate staff or answer your question.

**Trash bin theft:** I am receiving some complaints on trash bin theft. The best way to prevent theft is to mark your bin with your address using spray paint. Also, remember the trash bins were provided by Goode Company and belong to the residential address and must be left with the home when you move or sell the house. Contact town administrator if you have questions. Note some homes were empty at the time the new bins were delivered and in that case no bin was delivered as noted on our master list of bins delivered at each address.

**Trash service:** residents need to remember that excess trash stacked on top of the trash bin will not be picked up. Contact the Town Administrator if you have any questions regarding this service.

**Fox Way and Mohican Dr. Tot Lot:** much of the work on the tot lot playground was completed on Saturday, August 30<sup>th</sup> with over 30 community volunteers, the Mayor and several Council Members, public works employees, Charmain Turner, Forest Heights police department, and others worked hard all day to get most of the work done. We will add additional rock for the base, 2-3 inches of soil the poured rubber base and finally the laminated chain link fence. The tot lot is designed for youth ages 2-5 with adult or parental supervision. The tot lot was funded by a Kaboom/"Lets Play" grant of \$20,000, and the Maryland Department of Natural Resources /Maryland Community parks and playgrounds grant of \$28,000. As with most projects like this, the cost can fluctuate and contingencies can exceed 20% to 25%.

**Seneca Dr. & Woodland Dr. Storm drain** is getting attention after it has been determined that the storm drain belongs to the Town. The Town failed to meet county requirements back in October 1994. Now it must be fixed and it will be much more expensive than if it had been fixed to meet county standards in 1994.

**Numerous repair projects coming up:** the circle park, pot holes, the retaining wall at the municipal parking lot entrance to the building, the parking lot road at the side of the building to the upper level of the parking lot, drainage repair on Cree Dr. Sidewalk construction on n. Huron Dr. Street repairs.
